Thetis Island Residents and Ratepayers Association

The Thetis Island Residents and Ratepayers Association (TIRRA) is an advocacy organization for Thetis Island residents. TIRRA promotes the welfare of Thetis Island, its residents and land owners and fosters the protection and improvement of the quality of the Thetis Island community and its environment. It provides and coordinates local services, communications, solid waste management, St. Margaret's Cemetery, trails and transportation.

Communications is provided through several avenues, these include Espokes (daily email), Thetis Island phone book, visitors' guide, welcome package and the TIRRA community website.

Espokes is a daily email that provides local news about affairs and activities, and advertisements by local residents. Subscription to the service is available at <https://subscribepage.io/KUKwRy>. Notices and posts are made by sending an email to: espokes@gmail.com. ESpokes derives its name from the "spokes" of the original phone "wheel" used to communicate among islanders.

Thetis Island Phone Book: its purpose has always been to make it possible to keep in touch with neighbours, either for casual chats or for more important matters. The purpose has never changed, yet the listings have grown. The book provides information for emergency services, useful island information, as well as contact information for island friends to keep in touch. New phone books are published every 2 years.

The Visitors' Guide is a publication that lists island businesses and services available to residents and visitors to the island. It also includes information about local garbage disposal resources and fire department guidelines.

Welcome Package is provided for new residents and contains essential information about the island and its surrounding areas.

thetisland.net is the TIRRA community website. The site provides information about the island, its organizations and where services can be found. The webcam for the Thetis Island ferry lineup is available here, as well as advertisements for local island businesses and real estate, to provide a focal point and source of information for residents.

Solid Waste Management: on island household garbage can be disposed of at 501 Pilkey Point Road, on Saturday and Wednesday between 9am and 12 noon. Fees apply to volume delivered. Thetis does not have a recycling facility; these can be brought to recycling centres on Vancouver Island.

St. Margaret's Cemetery is over a hundred years old, on the original homestead of the Burchell family, some of the earliest settlers rest here. TIRRA holds the title and pays insurance for the lands; the operation of the cemetery is conducted by a board of volunteers reporting to the Province of British Columbia.

Trails: TIRRA maintains a number of trails on Thetis Island for residents and visitors to experience the extraordinary beauty of our natural environment. This network of trails on the island represents one of the most striking and unusual aspects of this wonderful community. Every step you take through the magical forests and meadows in our trail system is because of the generosity and trust of private owners and the management of dedicated volunteers.

Transportation: TIRRA works with the BC Ministry of Transport and Transit (MOTT) to maintain the road system for the safety of residents and services. This also includes the liaison with BC Ferries for the transportation between Vancouver Island and Thetis.

All Thetis Island property owners and residents, full or part-time, are encouraged to become members of TIRRA. Membership is \$10 (individual) or \$15 (2people) per year and supports all the above-mentioned community activities.
