

3. What are TIRRA's set of values from which policy, procedure and action is developed?

- Contemporary organizations hold (and proceed from) a set of values that, like a compass, encompass four areas -

- fiscal (financial)

- environmental

- social/emotional

- equity (access to all, regenerative aspects that cycle back to benefit the community - employment, composting)

- A recycling fee is fiscal; what of the other three? financial matters, in and of themselves in exclusion, represent a capitalist strategy, not a philosophy per se.

- Point of confusion? Over the past two years TIRRA has paid an employee for eight hours a week to manage garbage in-take and a clearly diminished use of the yard (garbage traffic is minimal). If we're concerned about fiscal responsibility why were these hours of operation not altered?

4. Does TIRRA, as a body of local governance on a parcel tax designation, have a plan on how collectively as a concerned community we can help mitigate climate change?
